
Lowell Area Recreation Authority (LARA) formed to research ways to better the recreation opportunities for residents in the Lowell Area. Through a grant provided by the Lowell Area Community Fund of the Grand Rapids Foundation, LARA worked with Landscape Architects & Planners, Inc. to develop the Lowell Area Trailway Master Plan.

The Trailway is designed to connect several important community elements such as parks, schools, public facilities, and businesses with a non-motorized trailway. The Trailway will benefit the health, safety, and general welfare of the entire Lowell area with while improving non-motorized transportation and recreation opportunities.

The board consists of seven members: an elected official from Lowell Township, the City of Lowell and Vergennes Township, a resident from each municipality and a jointly appointed resident. This multilateral cooperative effort is intended to give the Lowell area an equal voice in the planning efforts. The board meets monthly and encourages community participation.
