Old Business

Terms of Office. Amendment to LARA agreement eliminating the term limit has been approved by Vergennes Township and will go to City of Lowell and Lowell Township Boards for approval.

New Business

Development committee researched obtaining 501(c)3 status for LARA and recommends applying for status for better opportunities in funding and receipt of donations. Application cost is \$750. Motion made and passed to apply for 501(c)3 status.

Steve Mueller discussed plans for speakers and tours at Wege/Wittenbach Center. Walks will be held on first Sunday of each month. WWC will be needing volunteers to help with tours and sponsors for speakers.

Mari presented schedule of LARA meeting dates for 2007. Dates are 2nd Wednesday of each month, with locations rotating between the 3 municipal governments. Locations may vary for special events. Motion passed to approved schedule.

Potential routes for first segment; Wege/Wittenbach Center to Cherry Creek Elementary School

Funding;

Major fund raising campaigns to be started after route is confirmed. Some donations have been made, including Lowell Snowmobile Club when they disbanded and a recent donation by the Lowell Rotary Club. A grant by the Lowell Community Fund was used for the master plan work.

All meetings open to the public. Second Wednesday of each month at 6 p.m. Location rotates between Lowell City Hall, Vergennes Township Hall and Lowell Township Hall.

Carolyn Kane of West Michigan Trails & Greenways Coalition (WMTGC) provided update on efforts to buy and convert abandoned railroad line south of Lowell and fund raising campaign for WMTGC

Meeting open to questions and comments;

Citizen requested answers to question on flyer distributed to elementary school children;

No tax increases for construction of trail.

Property rights – LARA does not have power to condemn property for trail. All easements to be voluntary.

Maintenance costs to be covered by each municipal government. Volunteer groups will be used as much as possible.

Trail will be built approximately 2 years after easements are obtained.

The Trail may be plowed in the winter, depending on available funding.

LARA has insurance policy to cover liability.

Trail system will take many years to build all the potential routes identified in Master Plan. Other cities have experienced increased interest in their trails, as segments get built demand increases for more connections.
